Term 3 School Reopening: Lower Secondary

We want to express our appreciation for your understanding and support in our partnership as we continue to provide meaningful learning when Home Based Learning (HBL) took place from May 18 to 28 May. With the new school term commencing on Thursday 1 July for the **Lower Secondary**, we would like to keep you updated on the following:

Home-Based Learning (HBL) (28 to 30 June)

During the period of HBL, we will provide instructions and support for your child/ward to access a range of both online and hardcopy HBL resources so that learning continues. More information will be available at the school website <https://presbyterian.moe.edu.sg>. If your child/ward needs learning or emotional support, he/she can approach our teachers and other school personnel such as our allied educator and school counsellor, who will continue to work from school. During this period of HBL, if you are unable to secure alternative care arrangements and wish to place your child/ward in the school, you may approach the school for assistance.

Classroom lessons (from 1st July onward)

Students will be attending face to face lessons with their teachers. Teachers will follow up with the students' learning and provide support to address any queries or learning gaps that the students may have. At all times students and teachers are to wear high filtration face masks in accordance to the guidelines issued by MOH.

Vaccination

Students are to inform their PE, CCA and other relevant teachers about their vaccination date so that they will be exempted from Physical activity for a week.

As the COVID-19 situation persists, school will continue to upkeep **Safe Management Measures** such as practise good personal hygiene, decongest venues, and safe distancing. To ensure school is a safe place for teaching and learning, we seek parents'/guardians' support to remind your child/ward to bring his/her personal thermometer and trace together token daily to school.

We also encourage parents/guardians to practise social responsibility that your child/ward with flu-like symptoms is to stay away from school and seek medical attention immediately. Likewise, should any household member who have flu-like symptoms, your child/ward should also stay away from school. Every cautious effort helps to minimise the transmission risk in the school and community.

To ensure a safe and hygienic environment for teaching and learning to take place, our school's facilities have been thoroughly cleaned and sanitized to receive our students and staff when the new term begins.
